Travelling by Train/Tram

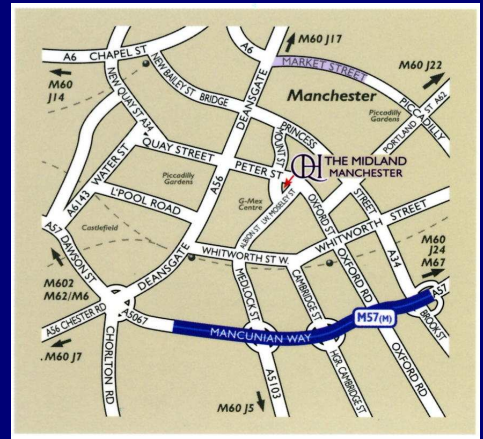

Manchester International Airport is near to the city centre. Trains run directly from the Airport to Manchester Piccadilly, with six trains per hour from Monday to Saturday.
